The Streets of the City of London, circa 1811. These cards mark the 200th Anniversary of the publication of the first complete pack of English Transformation cards. Cards with designs representing the names of the City streets. The Jokers are representations of the two mythical giants Gog and Magog in the Guildhall in the City of London.

Back design with the City of London dragon. Ace of Spades with portrait of the Master Jonathan M F Crowther

Ace of Hearts with portrait of the Master's Lady.

Approximately 350 Twin packs issued with a descriptive booklet including the names of the streets as shown.

The Master Lance E Whitehouse chose the 200th Anniversary of the birth of Charles Dickens as his commemoration.

Court cards and Jokers with cartoons of characters from Charles Dickens novels.

Ace of Spades with portrait of the Master in colour. Design by Brad Baker.

Approximately 375 Twin packs issued with a leaflet endorsed by the Lord Mayor.

Similar packs were printed by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor Alderman David Hugh Wootton, with the Lord Mayor's portrait on the Ace of Spades and the Lord Mayor's coat of arms in place of the Company's coat of arms. These single packs, in a tuck box where made to raise funds for the Charles Dickens Museum of which Alderman Wootton is the Chairman of Trustees.

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee, the 60th anniversary of her ascension to the throne and the beginning of her reign in 1952. The Court cards depict famous portraits of Kings, Queens and Princes of Wales from the Royal Houses of Tudor, Stuart, Hanover, Saxe-Coburg and Windsor.

A gift of these cards was sent to Her Majesty the Queen.

The Ace of Spades contains a portrait of the Master, Rev'd Canon Nigel Nicholson CF DL. 364 twin packs were produced with a descriptive leaflet written by L/M Nicholas Parsons containing a unique timeline graph of the duration of Royal reigns since 1066.
